And suddenly I knew, suddenly I realized: God is still in control. God doesn't want us to be afraid. And He will be near you--in ways more awesome than you can imagine!



Worship Committee Highlights

Worship committee meeting was called to order after opening prayer 7 in attendance.

Upcoming church holidays discussed, including **All Saints Day** which will be celebrated on Sunday, 11/4/18 during worship service. Everyone is welcome to come forward, speak the name(s) of those who have passed on and light a candle in their honor. We will also be celebrating **Christ the King Sunday** on 11/25/18.

Advent begins 12/2/18. Hanging of the greens will take place on Saturday, 12/1/18 at 10:00 a.m. Everyone is welcome to come help decorate the church inside and out. An all-call will be made the day prior as a reminder.

Weekly snacks/coffee will be provided each Sunday during Advent prior to worship. This will take place in the lobby and be available for everyone. A sign-up sheet will be placed in lobby in November for anyone wishing to donate snacks for any of the Sundays.

Worship members will be asking families/groups to do readings during Advent. Crystal will provide the weekly readings. Wall banners will be placed in sanctuary each week prior to the service.

The children of the church will be invited on 12/2/18 to come forward during worship to help finish decorating the Christmas tree behind the altar while the congregation signs hymns/carols.

Christmas Eve service will take place 12/24/18 and will be moved up an hour to 9:00 p.m. A sign-up sheet will be placed in lobby for those needing a ride to the service, as well as those planning on attending that would be willing to pick up those needing a ride.

Poinsettias will be ordered through McCabe's. They will be \$15/each and choices will be red, pink, or white. Order forms will be provided from 11/18/18 to 12/9/18. Delivery will be scheduled for 12/22/18 at 11:00 a.m.

The Worship Committee will provide snacks/drinks for the Recovery Service taking place at TVUMC on 10/24/18.

Church Council Highlights

The Church Administrative Council met on September 12, 2018 with eight of fifteen members present. There were no visitors. Pastor Crystal opened the meeting with prayer. The following are the meeting highlights.

Treasurer's Report: The August 2018 financial report was presented and reviewed. A summary follows:

For the General Account for the month, there were deposits of \$9,802.00 and withdrawals of \$9,899.67 leaving a balance of \$3,094.88. The average weekly deposit through 34 weeks is \$2,115.31 which is \$493.02 below the weekly budget need of \$2,608.33.

For the Special Account for the month, there were deposits of \$3,836.45 and withdrawals of \$157.92 leaving a balance of \$20,580.74. Fund accounts of interest are: Faith Promise - \$5,374.51 and Capital Improvement - \$7,510.64 which includes the \$2500 grant for the hearing assist system. The cost of that new system and the new microphone is \$2,944.

Trustee's Report: Bill provided the following information:

An air quality check at the parsonage is required every two years. This was done by Brock Restoration at a cost of \$200. There were no issues found. He also had to complete a handicap accessibility assessment for the upcoming charge conference. There are many areas of need to meet accessibility requirements. These could be used for grant requests in the future.

The parsonage basement has some corrective needs before the floor can be coated. Nick is working on those needs.

Christian Education and Family Ministry Committee: A nursery clean-up is scheduled for Saturday, September 29th at 10:00 AM.

Pastor Crystal reported that 14 children attended the first Junior Group meeting on Sunday, September 10th.

Missions Committee: Faith Promise Sunday will tentatively be Sunday, October 14th, with October 21st being an alternate date, depending on the speaker's availability. Also the suggestion for Faith Promise goal pledges to be \$5000 this year. More information will follow as we approach the Faith Promise Sunday date.

Pastor Crystal: She reported on her project to rebuild our church website. The site is directed at those who do not attend our church regularly with more visuals of our church in action. Nancy made a motion to purchase this new provider and change. After discussion, the motion was approved. Billie noted that we are having difficulties with the AllCall system and is considering a switch to a new supplier when the renewal is due.

Secretary: The new microphone has been received and installed and provides better pick-up than the previous model. The hearing assistance system is now scheduled to be installed on September 28th.
