Even if it takes longer to see each other's faces than we had first thought.

Most important, know that you are dearly loved. You are loved by our church. You are loved by God. And no matter what, God is with you. God is with our church. God will see us through.

Financial Report

Treasurer's Report for March and April 2020 combined:

The General Account opened the month of March with a balance of \$6,380.35. There were deposits of \$13,887.00 (March) and \$8,886.75 (April) for a total of \$22,773.75. There were expenses of \$7,455.25 service charges of \$35.00 (March), and \$8,149.62 (April) leaving a balance of \$13,514.23. The average weekly offering through April was \$2,256.57 which was \$3.48 less than the weekly budget need of \$2,260.06.

The Special Account opened the month of March with a balance of \$18,576.29. There were deposits of \$3376.12 (March) and \$665.00 (April) for a total of \$4,041.12. There were expenses of \$350.00 (March) and \$70.00 (April) leaving a balance of \$22,197.32. The balances in Capital Improvements and Faith Promise were \$6154.37 and \$6,872.90 respectively. The balance in the Music fund was \$2,605.00.

May deposits for the first four weeks of May were as follows:

General Account—\$5,814.00.
Special Account—\$10,104.92.

Primary Voting News and Changes

Tanner Valley UMC has been asked and permission has been granted to use the church building, specifically the Fellowship Hall, as a Vote Center for the 2020 Primary and General Election. There are, some important changes to what has been the practice in past election cycles.

First, the primary election has been moved from May 5th to June 2nd. This rescheduling is being done to support individual safety during the current COVID-19 pandemic and the associated countermeasures.

In order to avoid unnecessary contact with church members and minimize contamination, we will NOT be offering baked goods and coffee as we have in previous voting cycles. Larry Delp will be onsite for the day to provide direction to the voters and to maintain sanitation stations and church decontamination.

Second, there have been changes to the voting locations for the Primary and General Elections. These Vote Centers are different than in the past. Also, there is no need to vote only at the precinct where voters were previously directed. Voters may use any of the Vote Centers to vote. All information for registered voters in Dearborn County will be available at all Vote Centers and a vote will be recorded to preclude the potential for casting more than one vote. A post card with the Vote Center locations was sent to all registered voters in March. For most of our congregation, the Vote Centers in our area are:
